ROCK EAGLE CELEBRATES 50 YEARS OF SERVICE TO GEORGIA

Nearly 1,000 past and present campers, counselors, 4-H delegates and friends of the Rock Eagle 4-H Center gathered on June 25 to celebrate its 50 years of service to the citizens of Georgia. The celebration, which began at 1 p.m. in the center's Talmadge Auditorium with a reception following at 2:30 p.m. in the Sutton Dining Hall, provided a great opportunity to take a look back at Rock Eagle's beginnings and look toward the future.

Jerry Whiteside, who was the state 4-H president when the center opened in 1955, served as the master of ceremonies, and current state 4-H president Scottie Rowell presided. Virgil Adams was also present to offer comments and share memories of Rock Eagle 4-H Center with the group.

The Rock Eagle 4-H Center has been the scene for many childhood camp memories over the years. The event provided an opportunity for 4-H'ers to take a step back and recall fond memories of Rock Eagle. Arch Smith, Associate State 4-H Leader, provided a video history of Rock Eagle and highlighted some of the Center's future plans, including the addition of a new dining hall due to appropriations from state legislature, a miniature putt-putt course made possible through the generosity of Jim and Renee Williamson (*4-H Alum, Ben Hill County*) and the completion of the Georgia EMC Building and Senior Pavilion made possible by the support of Georgia's EMC's. Plans were unveiled for a new prototype cabin, with funds for the first cabin provided through the support of the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Cooperative Extension Service.

The evening also brought the dedication of the new swimming pool at Rock Eagle. The pool is located between the Callaway Building and the Museum of Natural History and covers nearly 5,000 square feet with a 10,000 square foot deck. The pool has a deep-water area with a one-half meter diving board, an 80-foot long lap pool with teaching area for swimming lessons, a seating area with water jets and a plunge area for a future waterslide. The beach entry allows for handicap access and includes water spray features. A 1,490 square foot pool house, made possible through the support provided by the Sarah L. Huff Estate, includes restrooms with showers, a concession area and an equipment room for the pumps and filtration systems (*See related story on page 2*). Drew Bowers, great-grandson of Sarah Huff, provided comments on behalf of the family and officially dedicated the pool during a ribbon-cutting ceremony.

Support to make the pool a reality came from 4-H members in the counties raising over \$110,000, as well as former counselors, private individuals and corporations. The Georgia 4-H Foundation is still seeking additional funds in the

amount of \$175,000 to completely fund the pool which was a \$650,000 investment.

Drew Bowers commented at the dedication ceremony, "I am the very proud great-grandson of Sarah L. Huff. On behalf of our family I'd like to say that even though "Huff", as I called her, was never a 4-H'er, she was one of this Club's biggest cheerleaders. She believed in 4-H because of the positive role 4-H played in her family's lives. She would be honored and humbled to have this support remembered through her estate gift by naming the new pool house for her. Thank you for joining me in honoring the remarkable life of my great grandmother and the legacy she left all of us. May we all be inspired by her generosity and find ways to help the next generation as she has helped us."

Rock Eagle is the largest of the five 4-H centers operated by the University of Georgia College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences. Each year thousands of youth participate in the Georgia 4-H Environmental Education Program at the Center. 4-H'ers from across the state come to its summer camping program made available through UGA Extension Service county offices. They also attend competitive events, leadership conferences and rallies at the Center. Outside of traditional 4-H events, Rock Eagle also hosts civic, religious and business group conferences and meetings.

For the past 50 years, Rock Eagle has provided 4-H members with a safe and comfortable environment for learning and developing life skills. HUFF GIFT INSPIRED BY FAMILY TO BENEFIT 4-H

The concept known as "family philanthropy" took on a whole new meaning through the generous support of the Sarah L. Huff Estate. Sarah L. Huff's estate gift funded the construction of the pool house at the Rock Eagle 4-H Center, as well as a project endowment to support Georgia 4-H. Why is this type of giving unique for Georgia 4-H? Mrs. Huff never went to camp, presented a demonstration, or attended a 4-H club meeting. However, Mrs. Huff did experience 4-H through the eyes of her daughter, granddaughter and great-grandson.

The three generations of 4-H'ers inspired the gift that resulted in the realization of two important projects for Georgia 4-H. Huff's daughter, Peggy Little, is a retired extension secretary for Elbert County who saw the impact that 4-H has on young people and inspired the involvement of her daughter in the 4-H program. Huff's granddaughter, Katrina Little Bowers, was a Master 4-H'er in Achievement from Elbert County, and Huff's great-grandson, Drew Bowers is also an active Oconee County 4-H'er in the Sports and Outdoor Recreation projects. Mrs. Huff grew up on a farm near Athens and attended the Lucy Cobb Institute. She was not a college graduate, but through forging a successful career in banking, and being an astute money manager as a single mother during the depression, she was able to create the legacy that others are enjoying today.

When Mrs. Huff began her estate planning, she learned that she could create a Charitable Remainder Trust, which assured her substantial tax savings as well as the ability to gift charities. Believing in the family philanthropy model, she consulted her grandchildren to aid in decision-making for the trust's designated charities. Katrina and her brother, Neal Little, were encouraged to choose the charities they believed were in need of support and would provide a lasting legacy of their grandmother's gift. Katrina chose Georgia 4-H as the organization that was important to her family. Mrs. Huff honored this request through a Charitable Remainder Trust Estate Gift to the Georgia 4-H Foundation. Katrina says, "when I suggested 4-H to my grandmother, she immediately agreed. She had seen firsthand the opportunities that the club had afforded our family. She would write me at Rock Eagle camp and frame my Master certificate. She was also thrilled that her great-grandson, Drew, would benefit as a future 4-H member. Because I have stayed involved with the organization, I was able to remind her of the financial needs of 4-H and assure her that the money would be well spent by its current leaders."

The pool house at Rock Eagle 4-H Center now proudly displays the name of Sarah L. Huff and is a lasting reminder of the tremendous impact that can be realized by involving family in decisions regarding planned giving.

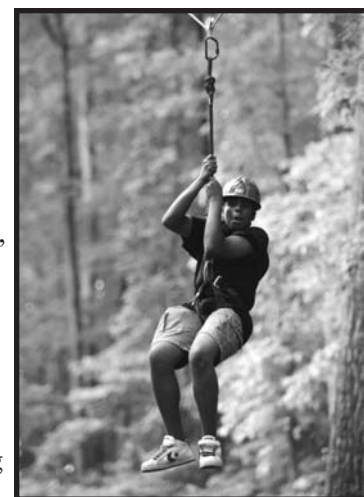
